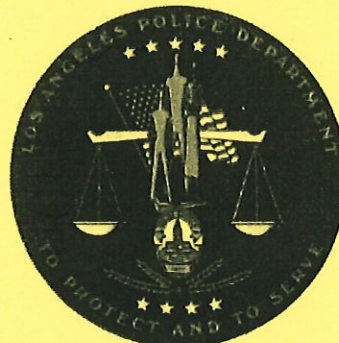

Values at risk associated to the incident include human safety, private and public property and associated improvements, electrical power infrastructure, and cultural values. Minimize acres burned on all lands by utilizing effective and efficient strategies and tactics while maintaining safety first. <u>Leaders Intent</u> Work effectively with cooperative partners towards a common goal of protecting values in a safe and efficient manner. All incident assigned personnel should be prepared to take the appropriate actions regarding: -Professional behavior, conduct timely and effective communications. -Personal safety and safety of others, including driving slowly, safely, and defensively. -Implementation of tactics that offer a high probability of success. -Manage fatigue by taking breaks and maintaining work rest cycles. <u>Management Objectives</u> -Fight fire aggressively while maintaining safe work practices to minimize threats to the public and emergency responders, all actions and efforts will focus on safeguarding the residents and resources of Los Angeles City and Los Angeles County. -Minimize damage to structures, private and public property, and other improvements in the fire area. -Ensure repopulation takes place in a quick, efficient, and effective manner. -Protect natural, cultural, and heritage resources. -Continue to foster and maintain positive relationships with all local cooperators and stakeholders. -Ensure coordinated, timely and accurate release of public information. -Ensure costs are aligned with mission priorities. <u>Control Objectives</u> Keep the fire North of Pacific Ocean Keep the fire South of Mulholland Drive Keep the fire East of Malibu Canyon Keep the fire West of the Interstate 405

WEATHER DISCUSSION:

...RED FLAG WARNING UNTIL 600 PM FRIDAY...

Widespread critical fire weather conditions will continue through the operational period. At the ridges and upper slopes, northeast winds will diminish through the afternoon, but will increase this evening and into early Friday morning. At lower elevations, expect some chaotic winds this afternoon as weakening offshore winds battle a weak onshore breeze, but the north to northeast winds will begin to increase this evening and into early Friday morning. Relative humidity will bottom out in the teens with poor overnight recovery.

For Friday and Saturday, weak diurnal winds are expected with some slight moderation of relative humidity. On Sunday and continuing into the middle of next week, a persistent offshore flow will return to the area. So, an extended period of weak to moderate Santa Ana winds can be expected Sunday through Wednesday with a 30% chance of strong Santa Ana winds Monday night and Tuesday. These conditions, if they develop, would bring another round of critical fire weather conditions to the area.

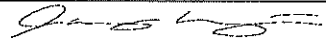

OUTLOOK FOR FRIDAY:

Mostly clear skies are expected. Afternoon high temperatures will be in the 60s to lower 70s. Overnight lows will generally be in the 50s. Relative humidity will bottom out in the teens with poor overnight recovery. Ridgetop winds will generally remain from the northeast. However at lower elevations, a diurnal wind pattern is expected with weak north to northeast winds during the night and morning hours and weak southerly/upcanyon winds in the afternoon and evening hours.

FIRE BEHAVIOR OUTPUTS

GENERAL: Fire will continue to spread laterally especially in areas where wind and topography are in alignment. Potential for slope reversals exists as fire transitions aspects. Pay particular attention as fires at the bottom of drainages sheltered from the wind can make uphill runs. Expect moderate to extreme fire behavior as critical rates of spread are forecasted.

SPECIFIC: BRANCH I: Lateral fire spread possible into Rustic Sullivan and Mandeville Canyons with increased fire behavior as slope revers may occur.

BRANCH VII: Fire is burning into Franklin scar however potential exists North in Dark canyon for growth.

BRANCH X: Fire will back against the wind upslope and make runs when in alignment towards Hondo Canyon

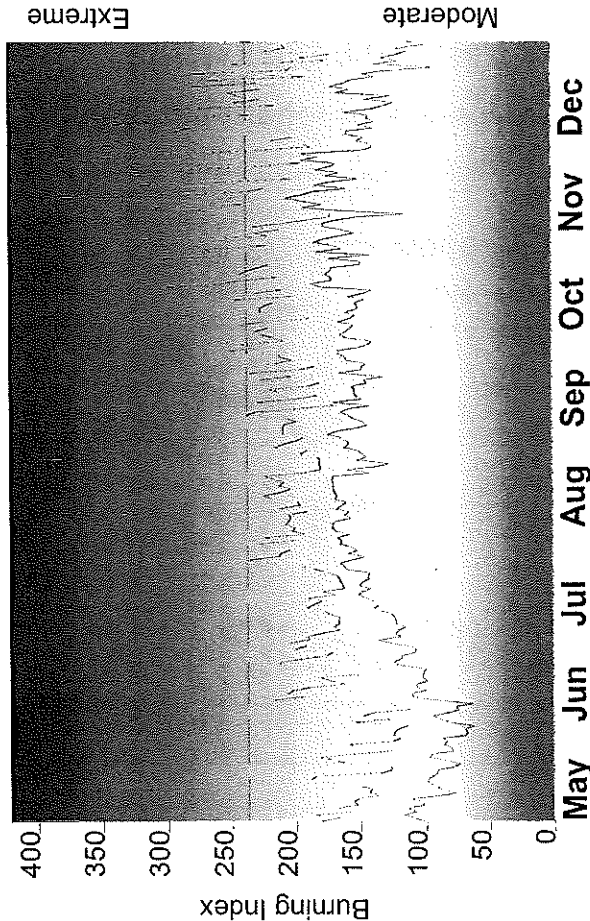

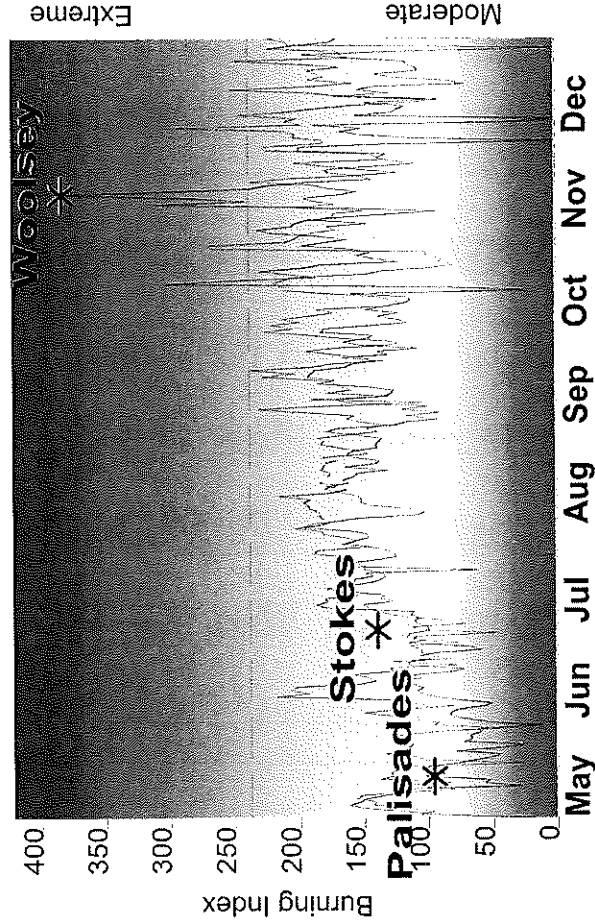
- ♦ Watch for spot fires and fires in the down-slope position. Short intense fire runs are possible
- ♦ Historical fires Calabazas & Corral where slope reversals caused firefighter injuries. Be alert when working with fire below
- ♦ Know your escape routes. Unburned fuel between you and the fire can lead to a watchout situation.

Local Thresholds - Watch out: Combinations

of any of these factors can greatly increase fire behavior:

20' Wind Speed over 30 mph, RH less than 20%,

Temperature over 80, Burning Index over 0

Remember what Fire Danger tells you:

- ✓ Burning Index gives day-to-day fluctuations calculated from temperature, humidity, wind, daily temperature & rh ranges, and precip duration.
- ✓ Wind is part of BI calculation.
- ✓ Watch local conditions and variations across the landscape -- Fuel, Weather, Topography.
- ✓ Listen to weather forecasts -- especially WIND.

SAFETY MESSAGE

RED FLAG WARNING!!!

Strong and Erratic Winds - Low Relative Humidities – Extreme Fire Behavior

- Check the communications plan for frequency assignments.
- Continue to drive slowly and cautiously; watch out for civilians and wildlife.
- When approaching Heavy Equipment, make eye contact with the operator.
- Multiple hazards in the WUI: Steep narrow roads, heavy fuel loading, wells, septic tanks, long escape routes, public presence, and power lines.
- Look Up, Down, and Around: Overhead, surface, and underground hazards.
- Leaders attend operational briefing and brief every firefighter every shift.
- Chronic dehydration is real. Don't let it catch up with you! Drink water!
- Be aware of fire behavior, and plan for slope reversal and reburn potential.

PALISADES INCIDENT RISK ANALYSIS (ICS 215-A)

LOC	HAZARDOUS ACTIONS/CONDITIONS	MITIGATIONS / WARNINGS / REMEDIES
ALL	EXTREME FIRE BEHAVIOR/WEATHER	-Fuels are receptive and will carry fire at a dangerous rate of spread. -Know your LCES and maintain Situational Awareness. -Use experienced Lookouts. -Monitor weather for changes in the wind, temp, and RH throughout the shift. -Have a contingency plan with established decision points and safety zones.
ALL	FATIGUE, HEAT, & DEHYDRATION	-Don't underestimate your task. Adhere to work/rest cycles. -DRINK WATER before, during and after shifts, up to 1.5 gal. per shift. -Review heat-related emergencies (IRPG Pg.110). -Monitor for signs of stack-effect of fatigue, heat, and dehydration.
ALL	PERSONNEL SAFETY	-All personnel are responsible for their personal safety. -Be sure to wear all required PPE while on the fire line, especially eye protection. -Make sure everyone gets a briefing on the plan for the day. -Document your briefings and actions on your ICS-214.
ALL	AIRCRAFT OPERATIONS	-Monitor air-to-ground frequencies; they are your eyes in the sky. -Use air-to-ground frequency to communicate with aircraft. -Monitor air-to ground for possible starts in the operational area. -Prepare for night time operations with signal lighting for crews and supervisors.
ALL	LINE CONSTRUCTION & IMPROVEMENT	-Conduct thorough briefings for all personnel. -Ensure LCES is in place prior to engagement. -Use Downhill Fireline Construction Checklist for downhill line construction.
ALL	STEEP TERRAIN / ROLLING DEBRIS	-Watch your footing while hiking in steep terrain. -Be careful of loose rolling debris. -Maintain Situational Awareness. -Know Tree Hazards in the work area. -Dangerous Winding Roads = SLOW Defensive Driving.
ALL	COMPLACENCY	-Remain engaged. -Maintain situational awareness and ensure LCES. -Know your assignment and objectives; communicate. -Have a plan. Primary, Alternate, Contingency, Emergency for all assignments.
ALL	DRIVING HAZARDS	-SLOW DOWN! -Conduct a 360* circle of safety prior to moving vehicles. -Drive with headlights and seat belts on; drive defensively. -Use chocks, spotters and backers. When in doubt, scout it out! -Dive carefully in camp. Do not ride on the exterior of moving vehicles.
ALL	MOP UP OPERATIONS	-Watch out for heavy equipment and crews working along roadways. -Be prepared for roll out when working on hillsides. -Identify hazards around structures, including compromised foundations and heat.
Br V	HEAVY EQUIPMENT	-Make positive contact with operator before approaching. -Use hand signals if other communications are unavailable. -Maintain a 50'-100' exclusion area around equipment. -Close roads or trails if necessary for public safety. -Maintain safe working distance from equipment.

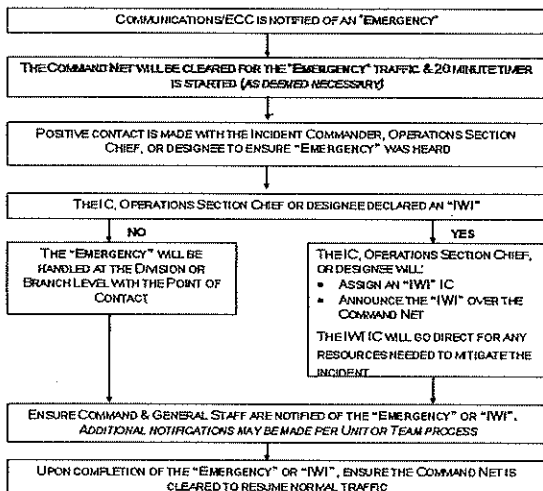
